#### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The proposed resolution would allocate \$1,375,000 from the Downtown Park Fund for Americans with Disability Act (ADA) accessibility improvements to Union Square.

The Downtown Park Fund (Fund) was created in 1985 to fund the creation of park and open space areas for the growing downtown daytime population. Planning Code section 412.5 requires a joint public hearing of the Recreation and Park Commission and the Planning Commission to allocate monies in the Fund for acquisition or development of park property. The RPC alone administers the development of the recreation and park facilities.

The Downtown Park Fund had an available balance of \$2,680,813 as of December 2014. The funding for this project (\$1,375,000) has already been appropriated and is not part of the remaining balance.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Union Square ADA Settlement and Enhancement Project (Project) is part of a settlement agreement from 2009. The settlement agreement required the City to remove specified barriers to access in the Plaza and Garage (Phase I or "Settlement Work"). The Mayor's Office on Disability also requested that RPD undertake additional disability access enhancements at Union Square Plaza in order to respond to subsequent public complaints (Phase 2 or "Enhancement Work"). A total of \$1,375,000 was appropriated to this Project from the Fund through the annual budget process in Fiscal Years 09/10, 10/11, and 11/12.

**Executive Summary** Hearing Date: May 21, 2015

Phase I (Settlement Work) construction began in October 2011 and was completed in February 2013 with \$524,000 from the Downtown Park Fund. RPD staff implemented this phase prior to obtaining authorization to appropriate the funds to the Project from the joint Recreation and Park and Planning The attached draft resolution would retroactively appropriate the funding from the Downtown Park Fund for the Phase I work (also known as Settlement Work). The Phase I work removed specified barriers to access including the re-grading of three pedestrian access ramps and a walkway, handrails extensions, a van-accessible garage entry, and improved directional signage. Attachment 2 provides a drawing illustrating the components of the Phase I scope of work, which was completed in February 2013.

The Phase 2 (Enhancement Work) is now ready for construction and would be funded with the remaining \$851,000 from the appropriated monies in the Fund. Prior to realizing that the Joint Commission action to authorize funding was not previously undertaken, RPD staff recommended and the the Recreation and Park Commission approved the contract for the Phase 2 Work on February 2, 2015. The Recreation and Park Commission resolution approving the contract for this work is Attachment 3.

The Phase 2 Work will include two other funding sources associated with specific project elements: 1) \$134,000 from the Open Space Contingency Fund for electrical work, and 2) \$50,000 from the Mayor's Office on Disability to fund two trench grate replacements. The Phase 2 Work also includes wheelguides, curbs, and lighting along specific pathways and seating areas. The total budget for the Phase 2 Work including all three funding sources is \$1,035,000. Attachment 4 provides a drawing illustrating the components of the Phase II scope of work.

Fund allocations are to be approved jointly by the Recreation and Park and Planning Commissions. The attached draft resolution would approve the expenditure for Enhancement Work (Phase 2) and retroactively approve the funding for the Settlement Work (Phase 1).

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW**

The Project (both Phase I and Phase II) was determined by the San Francisco Planning Department to be categorically exempt from environmental review, under Class 1(a) of the State CEQA Guidelines, Section 15301, pursuant to Title 14 of the California Administrative Code.

ALLOCATION OF \$1,375,000 FROM THE DOWNTOWN PARK FUND TO FUND PHASE I AND PHASE II IMPROVEMENTS TO UNION SQUARE, INCLUDING BLOCK 0308, BOUNDED BY GEARY, STOCKTON, POST AND POWELL STREETS; MAKING AND ADOPTING ENVIRONMENTAL FINDINGS AND FINDINGS OF CONSISTENCY WITH THE PRIORITY POLICIES OF PLANNING CODE SECTION 101.1 AND THE GENERAL PLAN.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors established the Downtown Park Fund on September 17, 1985; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Downtown Park Fund is to pay for acquisition and development of public recreation and park facilities for use by the daytime population of the C-3 Use District; and

WHEREAS, Planning Code Section 412.5 provides that the Fund shall be administered by the Planning Commission and the Recreation and Park Commission acting jointly; and

WHEREAS, Planning Code Section 412.5 further provides that the Recreation and Park Commission alone shall develop the recreation and park facilities on any acquired property designated for park use by the Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, in 2009 the City settled a lawsuit (Yates vs. Union Square, City of San Francisco; City of San Francisco Uptown Parking Corporation; Emporio Rulli Il Caffe Union Sq, INC.; Case No. C07-4087 JSW), and as part of the Settlement Agreement, specific barriers to access in the Union Square Plaza and Garage were identified for remediation, known as the Settlement Work, or Phase I Work, as described

and illustrated in the Settlement Agreement and Release of Claims approved by the Board of Supervisors on July 29, 2009 and as illustrated in the drawing titled "Proposed ADA Remediation Work" attached to the May 21, 2015 staff report to the Planning Commission; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the Settlement Agreement, additional barriers were identified and remediation recommended by the Mayor's Office on Disability (MOD), known as the Enhancement Work, or Phase II Work, as described and illustrated in the February 19, 2015 staff report to the San Francisco Recreation and Parks Commission titled "Union Square ADA Enhancement Contract"; and

WHEREAS, these two projects, the Settlement Work and the Enhancement Work, are known collectively as the Union Square ADA Accessibility Improvement Project ("Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Supervisors appropriated \$1,375,000 for use to fund the Project, from the Downtown Park Fund through the annual budget process in Fiscal Years 09/10, 10/11, and 11/12; and

WHEREAS, the Union Square Plaza is located within the C-3 district; and

WHEREAS, the Recreation and Parks Department ("RPD") completed the Settlement Work between October 2011 and February 2013, with \$524,000 allocated from the Downtown Park Fund; and

WHEREAS, the RPD is prepared to perform the Enhancement Work with the remaining \$851,000 allocation from Downtown Park Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Downtown Park Fund is an appropriate source for funding the Settlement Work and Enhancement Work; and

WHEREAS, The allocation for Downtown Park Fund for Phase I (Determination on March 24, 2011) and Phase II (Determination on December 29, 2014) improvements to Union Square are Categorically Exempt from Environmental Review under State CEQA Guidelines, Section 15301(a),15301(e)(2), as a Class 1 categorical exemption; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission and the Recreation and Park Commission met jointly on May 21, 2015 to elicit public comment on the proposal to use monies from the Downtown Park Fund to fund the Union Square ADA Accessibility Improvement Project, including the Settlement Work and Enhancement Work. Now therefore be it

**MOVED**, that the Planning Commission hereby approves the following:

#### **FINDINGS**

Having reviewed the materials identified in the preamble above, and having heard all testimony and arguments, this Commission finds, concludes and determines as follows:

- 1. The above recitals are true and correct and are adopted as part of this Motion.
- 2. The proposed allocation of funds will allow RPD to complete the Project,
- **3. General Plan Policies Consistency**. The proposed Resolution is consistent with the Objectives and Policies of the General Plan.

The project will not negatively affect existing neighborhood serving retail uses in San Francisco's neighborhoods.

2. That existing housing and neighborhood character be conserved and protected in order to preserve the cultural and economic diversity of our neighborhoods;

The project would conserve, protect and improve physical neighborhood character by improving the accessibility of Union Square.

3. That the City's supply of affordable housing be preserved and enhanced;

The project will enhance nearby market level and affordable housing.

4. That commuter traffic not impede MUNI transit service or overburden our streets or neighborhood parking;

The project will not impede MUNI transit service or overburden neighborhood streets.

5. That a diverse economic base be maintained by protecting our industrial and service sectors from displacement due to commercial office development, and that future opportunities for resident employment and ownership in these sectors be enhanced:

The project will not result in commercial office development or affect future opportunities for resident employment.

## 6. That the City achieve the greatest possible preparedness to protect against injury and loss of life in an earthquake;

The projects funding for removal of some existing garden open truss structures and improvements to the park landscape will protect against injury and loss of life in an earthquake.

#### 7. That the landmarks and historic buildings be preserved;

The project will not affect historic resources, buildings or landmarks. .

## 8. That our parks and open space and their access to sunlight and vistas be protected from development;

The project will fund improvements to Sue Bierman Park, and will not negatively affect parks or open spaces or access to sunlight and vistas.

- 5. The Planning Commission hereby retroactively approves the allocation of \$524,000 from the Downtown Park Fund to fund the Union Square Settlement Work.
- **6.** The Commission hereby approves the entire allocation of \$1,375,000 from the Downtown Park Fund for the Union Square ADA Accessibility Improvement project..






