Business Description

VJ Grocery is a family-owned, neighborhood grocery store located in the heart of Nob Hill. It is named after its opening on August 15, 1945, V-J Day (Victory over Japan Day). VJ Grocery is a retail store with tables outside for customers to enjoy coffee and snacks. It stocks a range of everyday items such as groceries, beverages, tobacco products, over-the-counter medications, and toiletries. Beyond its function as an essential neighborhood mart, it serves as a congregating point for the community. In addition to neighborhood locals, VJ Grocery serves guests of the nearby historical Huntington, Fairmont, and Mark Hopkins hotels, as well as the congregation of Grace Cathedral and visitors of the Masonic Auditorium.

Little is known about the first twenty-five years of VJ Grocery's operation. In 1970, Athanasios (Tom) Tsifourdaris, a recent immigrant from Greece, purchased the store. Soon, Tom's youngest brother, Spiros Tsifourdaris, began working for his brother and became owner of VJ Grocery in 1990. Most recently, in January of 2020, Anastasios Tom Taptelis, the husband of one of Spiros's twin daughters, Helen, took ownership of the store.

VJ Grocery is especially well-known for its role in the movie industry. Beginning in the 1960s, VJ Grocery has gained popularity from being featured in several motion pictures, including the famous film *Bullitt* (1968), starring Steve McQueen. In the film, McQueen's character frequented VJ Grocery to buy his famous frozen foods. VJ Grocery was also featured in *Hereafter*, starring Matt Damon, and directed by Clint Eastwood, as well as numerous commercials.

The business's primary location at 1199 Clay Street is a Category B (Unknown/ Age Eligible) structure on the southeast corner of Taylor and Clay streets in the Nob Hill neighborhood. It is within a RM-3 - Residential- Mixed, Medium Density Zoning District and a 65-A Height and Bulk District. 1199 Clay Street was included in the 1976 Department of City Planning Survey, where it received a rating of 2 on a scale of 0-5, with 5 being the highest rating for architecture.

Staff Analysis

Review Criteria

1. *When was business founded?*

The business was founded in 1945.

2. *Does the business qualify for listing on the Legacy Business Registry? If so, how?*

Yes. VJ Grocery qualifies for listing on the Legacy Business Registry because it meets all of the eligibility Criteria:

- a. VJ Grocery has operated continuously in San Francisco for 76 years.
- b. VJ Grocery has contributed to the history and identity of the Nob Hill neighborhood and San Francisco.
- c. VJ Grocery is committed to maintaining the physical features and traditions that define the organization.

3. *Is the business associated with a culturally significant art/craft/cuisine/tradition?*

No. The business is not associated with a culturally significant art/craft/cuisine/tradition.

4. *Is the business or its building associated with significant events, persons, or architecture?*

Yes. VJ Grocery is associated with the movie industry due to its appearance in numerous films, such as *Bullitt*, starring Steve McQueen, and *Hereafter*, starring Matt Damon. In *Bullitt*, McQueen's character frequented VJ Grocery to buy his famous frozen foods.

Due to its prominent role in the movie *Bullitt*, the business is associated with Steve McQueen, a famous action actor of the 1960s and 1970s.

5. *Is the property associated with the business listed on a local, state, or federal historic resource registry?*

No. However, the property that VJ Grocery is located within was included in the Department of City Planning 1976 Survey. The surveyors rated the building 2 on a scale of 0-5, with 5 being the highest rating for architecture.

6. *Is the business mentioned in a local historic context statement?*

No, not as of the date of this Executive Summary.

7. *Has the business been cited in published literature, newspapers, journals, etc.?*

Yes. There have been several features and articles on VJ Grocery, especially related to its role in the film industry. VJ Grocery has been referenced in many *Bullitt* fanfare publications, as well as in filmography articles. The market was also featured in the local television news (KRON 4) in reference to the COVID-19 pandemic.

WHEREAS, in accordance with Administrative Code Section 2A.242, the Office of Small Business maintains a registry of Legacy Businesses in San Francisco (the "Registry") to recognize that longstanding, community-serving businesses can be valuable cultural assets of the City and to be a tool for providing educational and promotional assistance to Legacy Businesses to encourage their continued viability and success; and

WHEREAS, the subject business has operated in San Francisco for 30 or more years, with no break in San Francisco operations exceeding two years; and

WHEREAS, the subject business has contributed to the City's history and identity; and

WHEREAS, the subject business is committed to maintaining the traditions that define the business; and

Section 4: Written Historical Narrative

CRITERION 1

a. Provide a short history of the business from the date the business opened in San Francisco to the present day, including the ownership history. For businesses with multiple locations, include the history of the original location in San Francisco (including whether it was the business's founding and or headquartered location) and the opening dates and locations of all other locations.

VJ Grocery, located at 1199 Clay Street, got its name because it opened in San Francisco on August 15, 1945, on V-J Day. Victory over Japan Day (V-J Day) was August 15, 1945, the day Imperial Japan surrendered in World War II, in effect bringing the war to an end. This was a significant day for all Americans, and the store opening on that historical day is a significant event in this neighborhood. Thus, the owner at the time named the business VJ Grocery, to commemorate this significant historical event.

Not much is known about the original owners of the business.

Athanasios (Tom) Tsifourdaris was the first person in the Tsifourdaris family to own the grocery store. He was an immigrant from Greece who came with a wave of people from Europe in the 1960s seeking the American dream. In 1970, he bought the store from the previous owners.

Tom's youngest brother, Spiros Tsifourdaris, immigrated to the United States in 1977 with his pregnant wife and began working for his brother.

Tragedy struck on January 30, 1990, when the single Tom Tsifourdaris, also affectionally know as Uncle Tom, had a heart attack at the young age of 45 and passed away that same day. Spiros, the youngest of six brothers, took over ownership of the business and supported his wife and two young twin daughters through the earnings of the store.

A third generation of Athanasios Tsifourdaris' family has just taken over ownership. Anastasios Tom Taptelis, the husband of one of Spiros' twin daughters, Helen, is now the proud owner and is happy to continue the legacy of the store in the family. He assumed ownership on January 15, 2020.

The store is a testament of the American Dream for many immigrants who flee poor circumstances to make a life in America and build a legacy for their future generations.

b. Describe any circumstances that required the business to cease operations in San Francisco for more than six months?

The business never ceased operations for more than six months due to any circumstances. The most the business ceased operations was just a couple days due to the 1989 Loma Prieta earthquake, but outside of that, no major closures.

During the COVID-19 pandemic when the city shut down in March 2020, the business never ceased operations, though there was an impact in the overall revenue. Tom Taptelis, the current owner, made sure that the store remained open for all, especially during the several quarantines, so that the neighborhood had a place to buy grocery essentials, as well as disinfecting supplies and masks. He made sure to keep these essential items in stock, so that everyone in the neighborhood felt safe and also provided much sought-after items at a discounted rate. Though his profit was not what it used to be, he took his role as an essential worker to heart to ensure the community's needs were being met in whatever way he could meet them.

c. Is the business a family-owned business? If so, give the generational history of the business.

Yes, this business has been owned by the same family since it was acquired in the mid-1970s. This store is still living on through the same family today. Please see Criterion 1A for a detailed explanation of the historical ownership of the Tsifourdaris/Taptelis family.

d. Describe the ownership history when the business ownership is not the original owner or a family-owned business.

The ownership history of VJ Grocery is as follows:

e. The historic resource status of the building that houses VJ Grocery is classified by the Planning Department as Category B, Unknown / Age Eligible, with regard to the California Environmental Quality Act.

CRITERION 2

a. Describe the business's contribution to the history and/or identity of the neighborhood, community or San Francisco.

The corner of VJ Grocery, along with Huntington Park, is the congregating intersection of the quiet Nob Hill neighborhood. Because of its location up a very steep hill and surrounded by other steep hills, there is a feeling of a close-knit small town, where almost everybody knows everybody, despite being in a large metropolitan city. This neighborhood is the type of neighborhood where neighbors know each other and say hello on the sidewalk and stop to catch up for “small talk.” It has a special homey feel, though it is right smack in the middle of San Francisco. The store itself is a key contributor to this feeling, as it is a gathering place where these neighbors can grab a cup of coffee and snack, sit outside next to the fresh flowers with their dogs, and build the close-knit community known as Nob Hill, as well as shop for essential groceries.

From the late 1960s to now, VJ Grocery has gained popularity from being featured in several motion pictures, including the famous film Bullitt (1968), starring Steve McQueen and directed by Peter Yates. Steve McQueen’s character’s apartment (<http://reelsf.com/reelsf/bullitt-bullitts-apartment>) was directly across the street from the store, and he would frequent the store in the film; there are even scenes with the inside of the store featured where he buys his famous frozen foods, and, of course, the famous timeless car chase scene took place in the surrounding streets and hills ([link](#)). Ever since then, many fans and tourists of the Bullitt film have visited the location to take pictures and even buy frozen TV dinners from the store.

b. Is the business (or has been) associated with significant events in the neighborhood, the city, or the business industry?

Because of the store’s location in the city, after Bullitt, there have been several more films filmed outside and inside the store, as well as commercials. These are always fun events for the residents of the area who get to see the production of a film or commercial, as well as spot famous actors. Below is a list of a few of the major motion pictures filmed at the store:

- Bullitt starring Steve McQueen
- Hereafter starring Matt Damon and directed by Clint Eastwood
- The Wedding Planner starring Jennifer Lopez and Matthew McConaughey
- George of the Jungle starring Brandon Frasier
- San Andreas starring Dwayne “The Rock” Johnson
- Several commercials, including Stella Artois, Cheez -It, etc.

c. Has the business ever been referenced in an historical context? Such as in a business trade publication, media, or historical documents?

VJ Market has been referenced in many Bullitt fanfare publications and filmography articles. It has also been featured in the local news (KRON 4) during the COVID-19 pandemic.

d. Is the business associated with a significant or historical person?

Yes, the business is associated with Steve McQueen, a famous action actor of the 1960s and 1970s.

e. How does the business demonstrate its commitment to the community?

The business is a neighborhood market that serves the residents in the area. The neighborhood itself is a high “foot-traffic” area, and the store is one of the very few corner stores in the area. Residents and passersby stop in to grab a quick refreshment, snack, etc., as well as buy groceries from there. Several people walk their dogs and sit at the tables outside to drink their coffee and/refreshments. It is truly a neighborhood store that serves the residents in the area.

During the COVID-19 crisis, the store stayed open, gave masks to the residents in the area for free, delivered groceries to high-risk populations, and so forth. The business considers all the residents in the area its customers, and continues to serve the community in any way it possibly can. The store was also featured at the start of the COVID-19 pandemic in the local news (specifically KRON 4, [link](#)) which aired on March 31, 2020. In this news piece, the owner spoke about the impact the pandemic had on business and other small grocery stores. Despite all the hurdles, his community and customers are a priority, and he found innovative ways to meet their needs.

f. Provide a description of the community the business serves.

The business serves the residents and passersby of the neighborhood in Nob Hill. It is a neighborhood grocery store. It also serves visitors and people staying at the nearby historical Huntington, Fairmont, and Mark Hopkins hotels, as well as the congregation of the Grace Cathedral and members of the Masonic temple – all famous historical buildings in the area.

g. Is the business associated with a culturally significant building/structure/site/object/interior?

Outside of VJ Grocery representing the Greek immigrants who came to America for a better life, no there is no other cultural significance to the store.

h. How would the community be diminished if the business were to be sold, relocated, shut down, etc.?

The store is a staple of the neighborhood. It is a congregating point for the residents in the area, a place where people can get together, chat, walk their dogs, and build a neighborly

community in a large city like San Francisco. The store contributes to the small town feel of Nob Hill because of its location, and it provides the residents with the opportunity to get to know each other despite living in a large city.

CRITERION 3

a. Describe the business and the essential features that define its character.

The exterior of the store has not changed significantly at all since the business was established. Through the decades, it has kept its old-world charm and neighborhood feel. There still is a large sign with the same name, VJ Grocery, commemorating V-J Day. The store is also reminiscent of the famous movie that was filmed there, Bullitt. The store is easily recognized by the many tourists and fans that make the trip to the neighborhood just to take a photo of the building.

b. How does the business demonstrate a commitment to maintaining the historical traditions that define the business, and which of these traditions should not be changed in order to retain the businesses historical character? (e.g., business model, goods and services, craft, culinary, or art forms)

The business is committed to keeping the name VJ Grocery for V-J Day. There are also photos of the film Bullitt displayed in the store, including stills from the film showing both the exterior and interior of the store. There are also plans for a Bullitt Day on October 17th, when the store plans to celebrate the anniversary of the film's release date and provide fun activities, like winning a week's worth of frozen dinners while entering a drawing.

c. How has the business demonstrated a commitment to maintaining the special physical features that define the business? Describe any special exterior and interior physical characteristics of the space occupied by the business (e.g. signage, murals, architectural details, neon signs, etc.).

The overall architectural design of the store has not changed, including the awning and the exterior signage, which were recently painted. The owner does not want to change the look of the store because of its significance to the film industry and the charm it offers the neighborhood, including keeping an exterior sitting area to promote community in Nob Hill.

d. When the current ownership is not the original owner and has owned the business for less than 30 years; the applicant will need to provide documentation that demonstrates the current owner has maintained the physical features or traditions that define the business, including craft, culinary, or art forms. 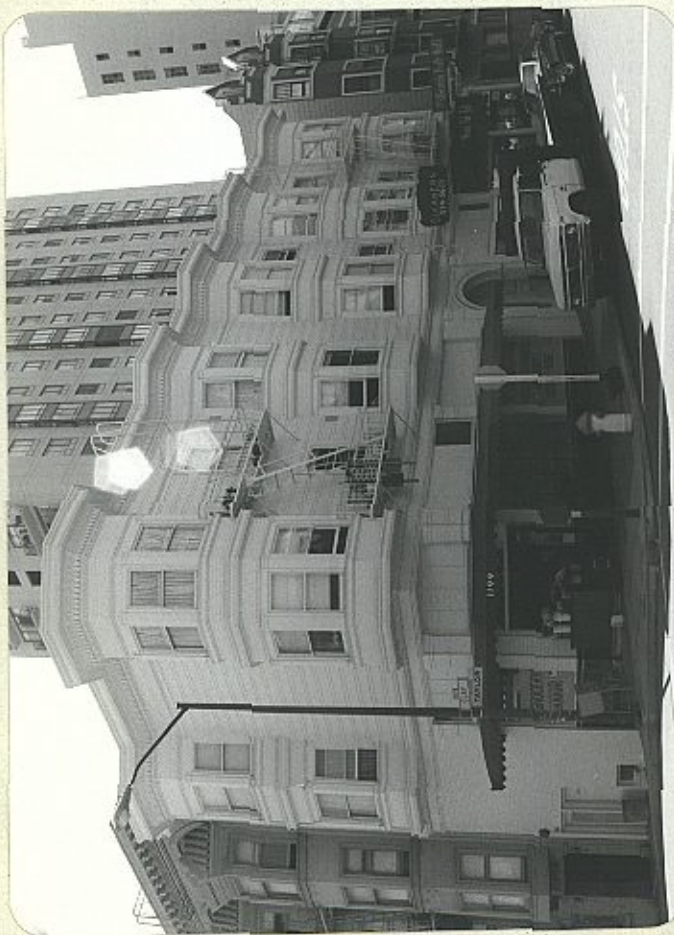

BULLITT - BULLITT'S APARTMENT

Below, director Peter Yates captures one of San Francisco's many vistas on a misty morning as Bullitt heads east down Broadway from Taylor on his way to his apartment (locals will recognize he's actually heading *away from* his apartment).

Then ... The Bay Bridge is in the distance and there's a small twin-domed church on the left.



... **and Now**, the church, Nuestra Senor de Guadalupe, was built in 1906 to serve the local Catholic community. It's now a Chinese day school.



Then ... He drives his Mustang down Clay Street, crosses Taylor, then makes a slick reverse (below) in front of the cream Austin Healey (CitySleuth is salivating

- he used to own one). Bullitt's apartment house, 1153 Taylor Street, is the dark blue house on the corner of Clay - his place is on the top floor.



... **and Now**, the building is repainted a light color and a garage has been added at the front corner.



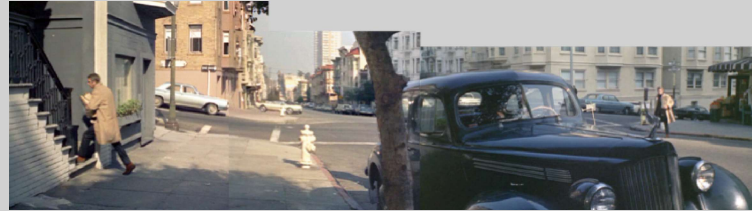
Then ... At the corner market opposite his apartment he isn't above helping himself to a newspaper when he's short of change.



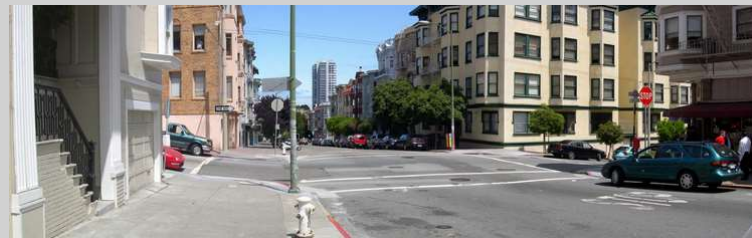
... and Now, the recent photo finds a market, V-J Grocery, still at the same location, 1199 Clay Street, where customers can still get their daily paper out front.



Then ... In the composited image below, Bullitt crosses Taylor and climbs the front steps to his apartment door.



... and Now, today's view, north along Taylor across Clay, is pretty much unchanged in over 40 years.



... and Now, below are the entrance steps of 1153 Taylor leading to the building's three apartments, 1153, 1155 and 1157. Bullitt's was 1153, the door on the left, which leads up to the top floor.



Inside the apartment Cathy has breakfast in the living room. The corner window view looks east down Clay Street - San Francisco Bay and part of Yerba Buena Island can be seen in the distance.

Brit director **Peter Yates** set the industry standard for car chases in this **San Francisco** based police actioner.

The brief prologue is set in **Chicago** with the briefest establishing shot of the **Chicago Sun Times Building** and the **Marina City Towers** – though the action itself was, like the rest of the movie, filmed in **San Francisco**.

Detective Frank Bullitt (**Steve McQueen**) has to track down a hit squad before the fact leaks out that their target, prize witness Johnnie Ross, has already been offed.



Bullitt location: Ross is spotted in the hotel lobby: Mark Hopkins Hotel, 1 Nob Hill, San Francisco

The doomed informant Ross is first spotted by the baddies in the lobby of the de-luxe **InterContinental Mark Hopkins San Francisco**, 999 California Street atop Nob Hill.

This grand **San Francisco** institution, built on the site of what was once one of the city's most prestigious mansions, is also featured in **Harold Robbins'** 1978 motor industry potboiler **The Betsy** and 1969 shocker **Daddy's Gone a-Hunting**.

The hotel stands alongside two other cinematic landmarks: the Fairmont Hotel (**The Rock**; **Family Plot**) and the Brocklebank Apartments (**Vertigo**; **The Woman In Red**).

It's downhill for Ross from here: the rather less grand 'Daniels Hotel' in which he's installed for his safety stood on **Embarcadero**, at **Howard Street** opposite Pier 18 beneath the foot of the double-deck **Oakland Bay Bridge**. The whole area has since been massively redeveloped and both the hotel and pier are gone.



Bullitt location: Bullitt stocks up on TV dinners: VJ Groceries, Clay Street, San Francisco

You can see Bullitt's apartment, unchanged, at **1153-1157 Taylor Street**, a stylish 1906 three-story frame building at the corner of Clay Street. And across the road you can still shop at **VJ Groceries**, where loner Bullitt stocks up on TV dinners.

Bullitt does chill out with girlfriend Cathy (**Jacqueline Bisset**) in the jazzy ambience of what was the groovy Coffee Cantata but has since been revamped to become Mexican restaurant **Flores**, **2030 Union Street** at Buchanan Street in **Cow Hollow**.

I am writing this letter to nominate VJ Grocery, located at 1199 Clay Street, San Francisco, CA 94080, for the Legacy Business Program in San Francisco, CA. I've known the family who has owned this business for over 15 years, and have been a patron myself whenever I have been in the neighborhood. The family and the store provide a welcoming atmosphere in the heart of the city. In addition, please see below how this business meets the eligibility criteria for the program:

1. The business has operated in San Francisco for 30 or more years with no break in operations exceeding two years.
 - a. VJ Grocery has been in business since V-J Day, August 15, 1945, and the owners just celebrated the 75th anniversary of their opening day this past August. Since that date, the business did not cease operations for any significant amount of time. Since the late 1970s, this business has been run by the same family for three generations.
2. The business has contributed to the neighborhood's history and/or the identity of a particular neighborhood or community.
 - a. This grocery store symbolizes several key historical events in San Francisco and the neighborhood. Its initial grand opening was on V-J Day, the day that officially ended WWII, but also commemorates a difficult time in San Francisco history, during one of the deadliest riots ever in the city. It is a standing landmark of the juxtaposition of a time of victory as well as civil unrest, and many years later, is still standing as a testament to the City's perseverance. Additionally, the store has gained fame amongst fans of the film, Bullitt, as it was a key location in the film. Since then, it is on Hollywood's short list of San Francisco film locations, where several films (Hereafter, The Wedding Planner, San Andreas, to name a few) have been filmed. As such, it continues to make history and provide character to the beautiful Nob Hill neighborhood of San Francisco.
